

In spring, we will resume construction on the North Portsea Island Coastal Defence Scheme and this year (2022) we will be building the defence at the Harbourside Park and the Harvester. You will see more activity in March as we start to make preparations, so we are ready to begin.

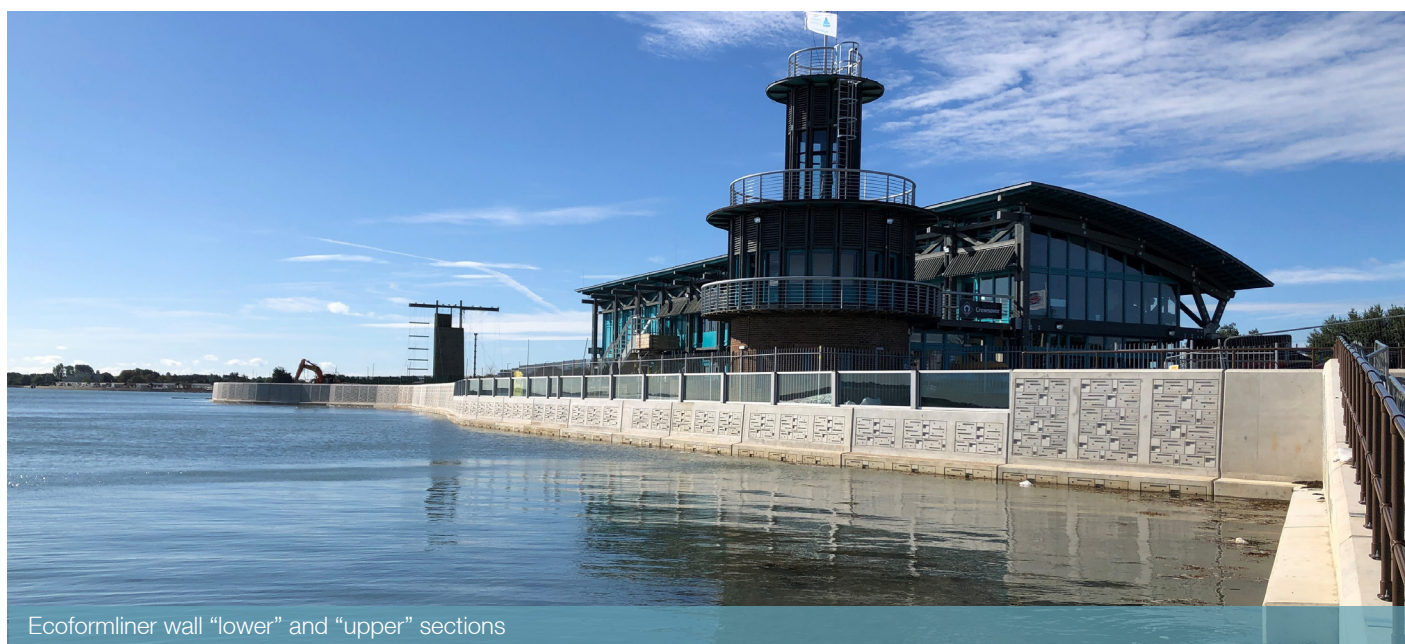

Officers from Mackley, Coastal Partners and Portsmouth City Council will be ready to answer any questions you may have about the North Portsea Island Coastal Defence Scheme. There will also be officers from Portsmouth City Council to provide information on the planned cycle path improvements along the Eastern Road.

No need to book, just drop in!

In 2021 we finished our second year of construction, we appreciate your ongoing patience and support during the work. We have finished a total of 600m of sea wall (including 100m of glass panels) from Kendalls Wharf up to the land north of Harbourside Park.

You will have noticed the preparation work around the Harbourside Park, which included the installation of a temporary fence to separate and protect the park from the working area. The fence is a little closer to the lodges than the original fence line, which allowed us to temporarily widen the coastal footpath. This was important to create enough space for the work on the defences to be carried out and for specialist equipment to fit.

Once all work is complete, the width of the path will be reinstated to 2.2m and a new permanent fence will be installed.

Finally, you may have noticed colleagues taking photographs and notes, measuring, taking samples and testing ground conditions deep underneath the ground. This is all part of preparation and investigation work, so the team will be able to conduct the work as safe and as efficiently as possible.



The path along the coast between the Andrew Simpson Centre and the Langstone Harbour Viewing Car Park will remain closed, however a diversion is in place (see map left). The new path (shown in blue) has been reopened.
